In the fall of 2012, she was an Immigration Intern at Ayuda, Inc. in Washington, D.C., individually managing a caseload of six immigration clients under attorney supervision. Ms. Powers traveled to Quito, Ecuador in the summer of 2012 to serve as an intern with International Rights Advocates. In that role, she prepared memoranda on civil litigation topics and wrote contracts in Spanish and English.

In June 2009, Ms. Powers received her Bachelor of Arts, *magna cum laude*, in International Relations and Spanish from the University of Denver. She was elected to Phi Beta Kappa and

served as President of the University of Denver Volunteers.
